

PicBoard for iPad

Instructions for using Boardmaker images

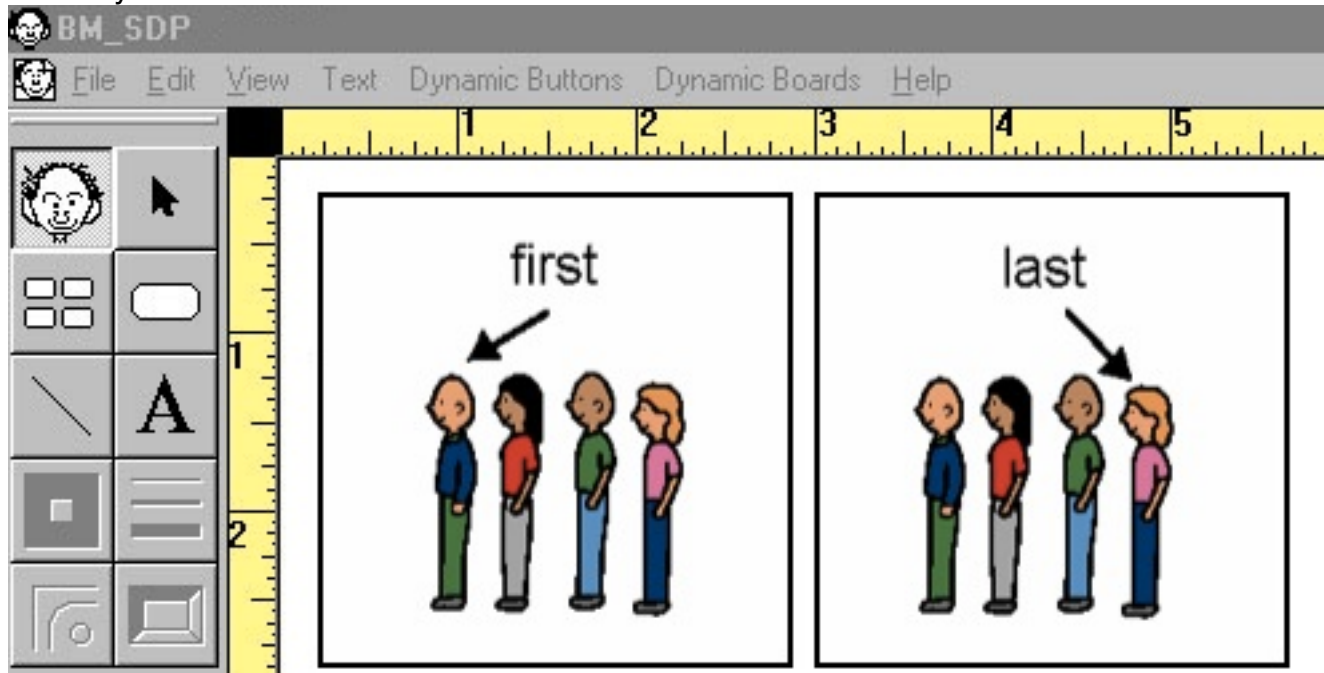
Boardmaker images are protected so they can't be used directly in PicBoard. That's why we have provided the free PicCutter app, which helps you to use Boardmaker images in PicBoard.

Step 1

Download the free PicCutter tool from the following link: <http://www.mashley.net/PicCutter.exe>

Step 2

Create your Boardmaker board as usual.

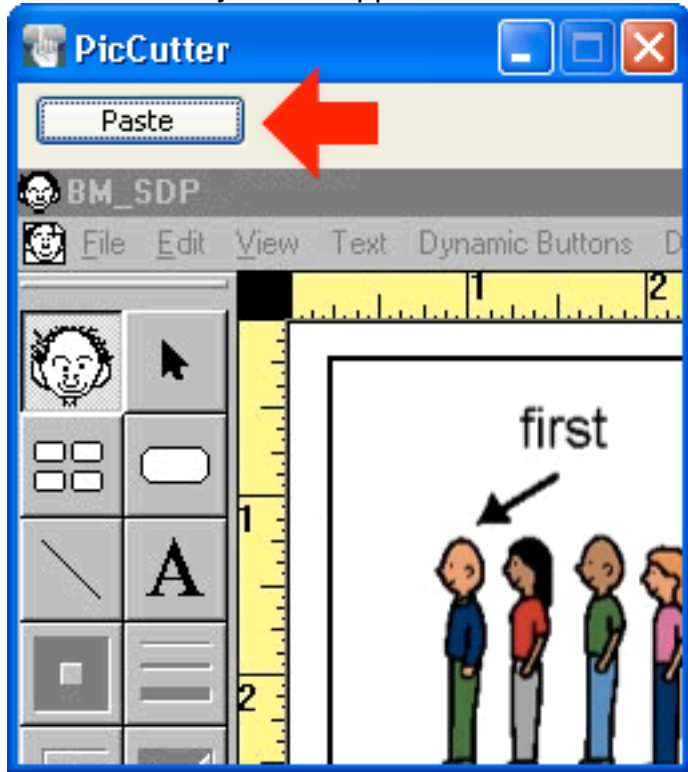


Step 3

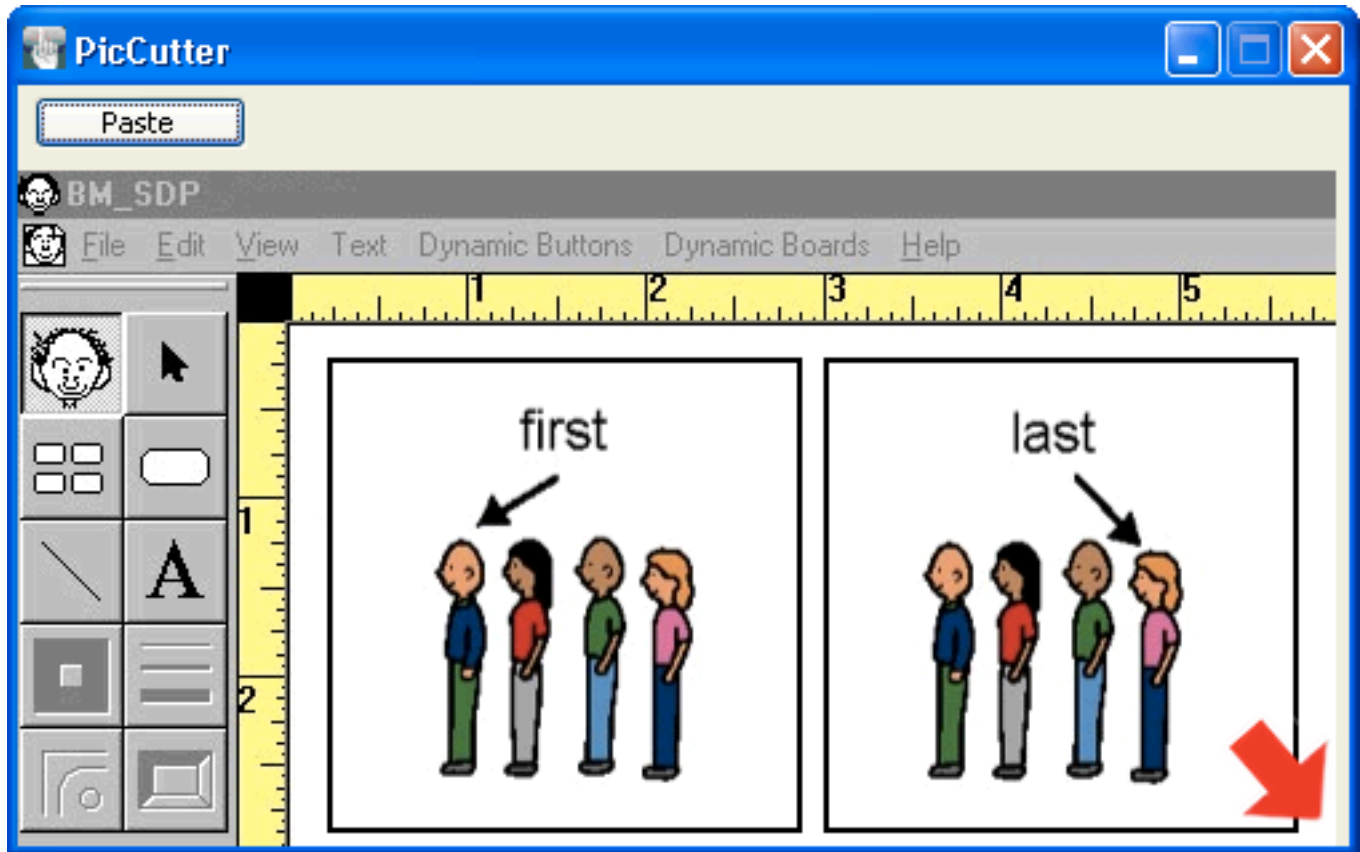
With Boardmaker still open, hold down the Shift key on your keyboard and press the Print Screen button.



Step 4
Open PicCutter by double clicking on PicCutter.exe. Once it's open, press the Paste button. Your Boardmaker layout will appear in the window.

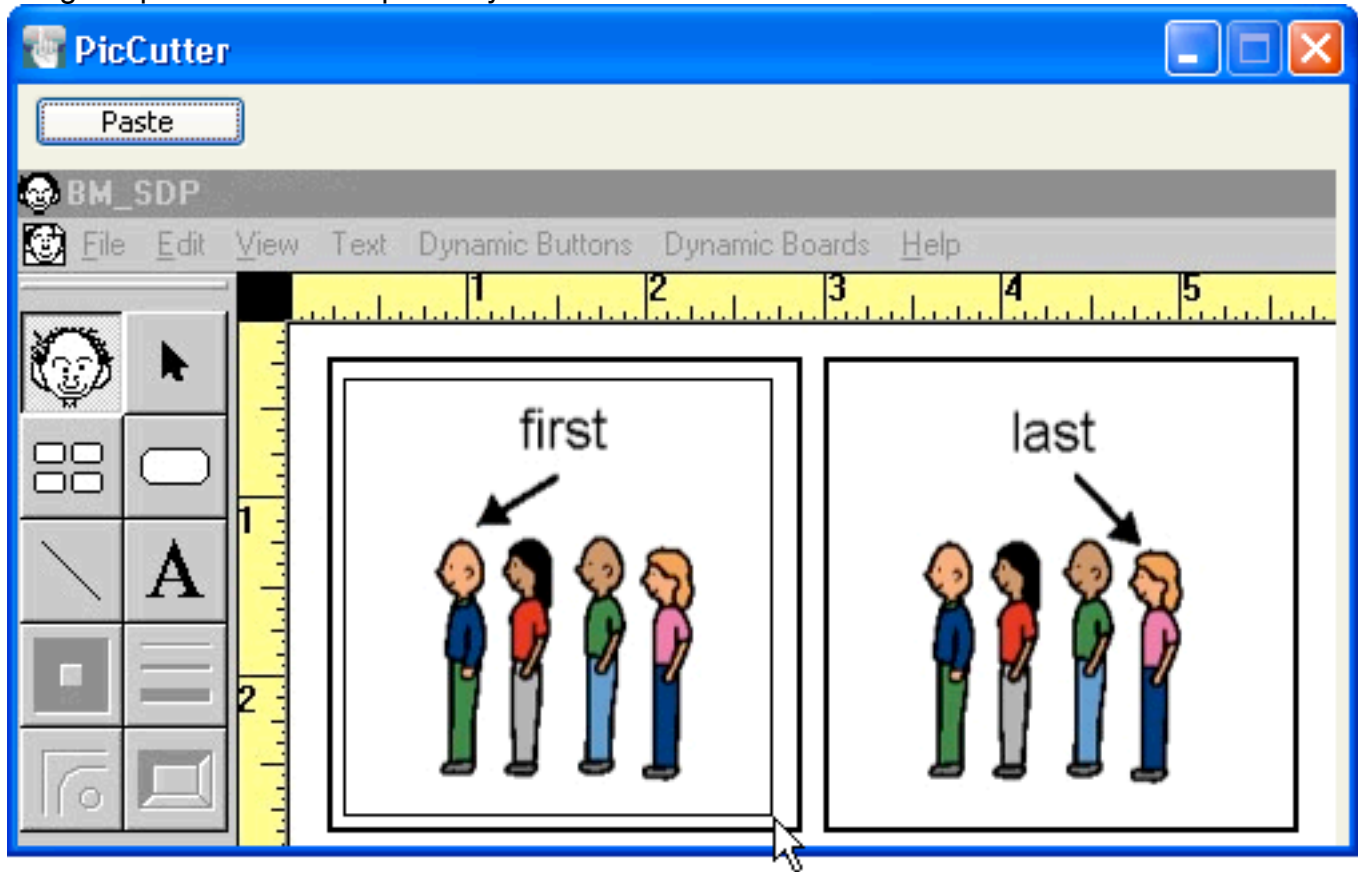


Step 5
You can resize the window if you need to see more of the picture, by dragging the bottom right corner of the PicCutter window.



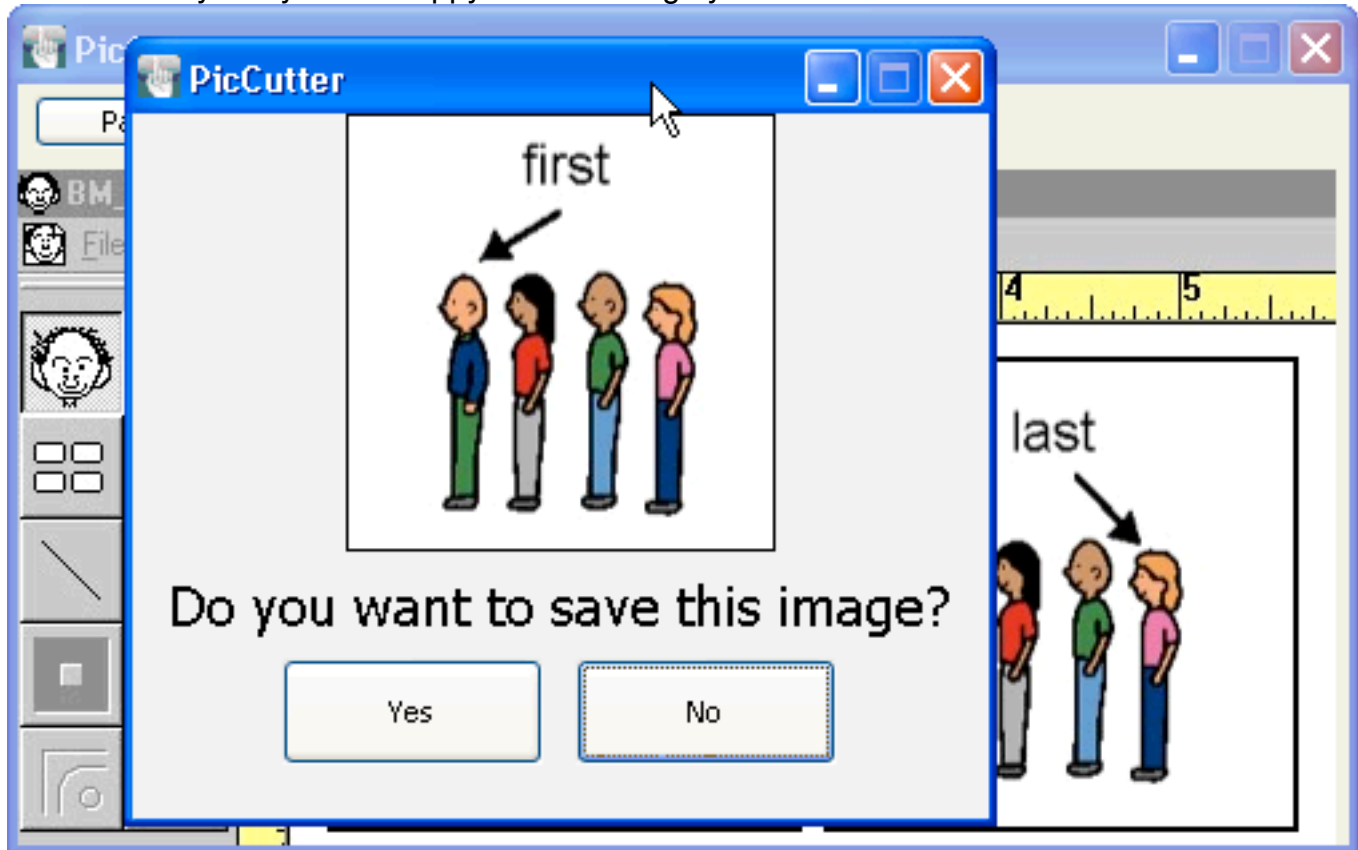
Step 6

Drag a square around the picture you want to use in PicBoard.



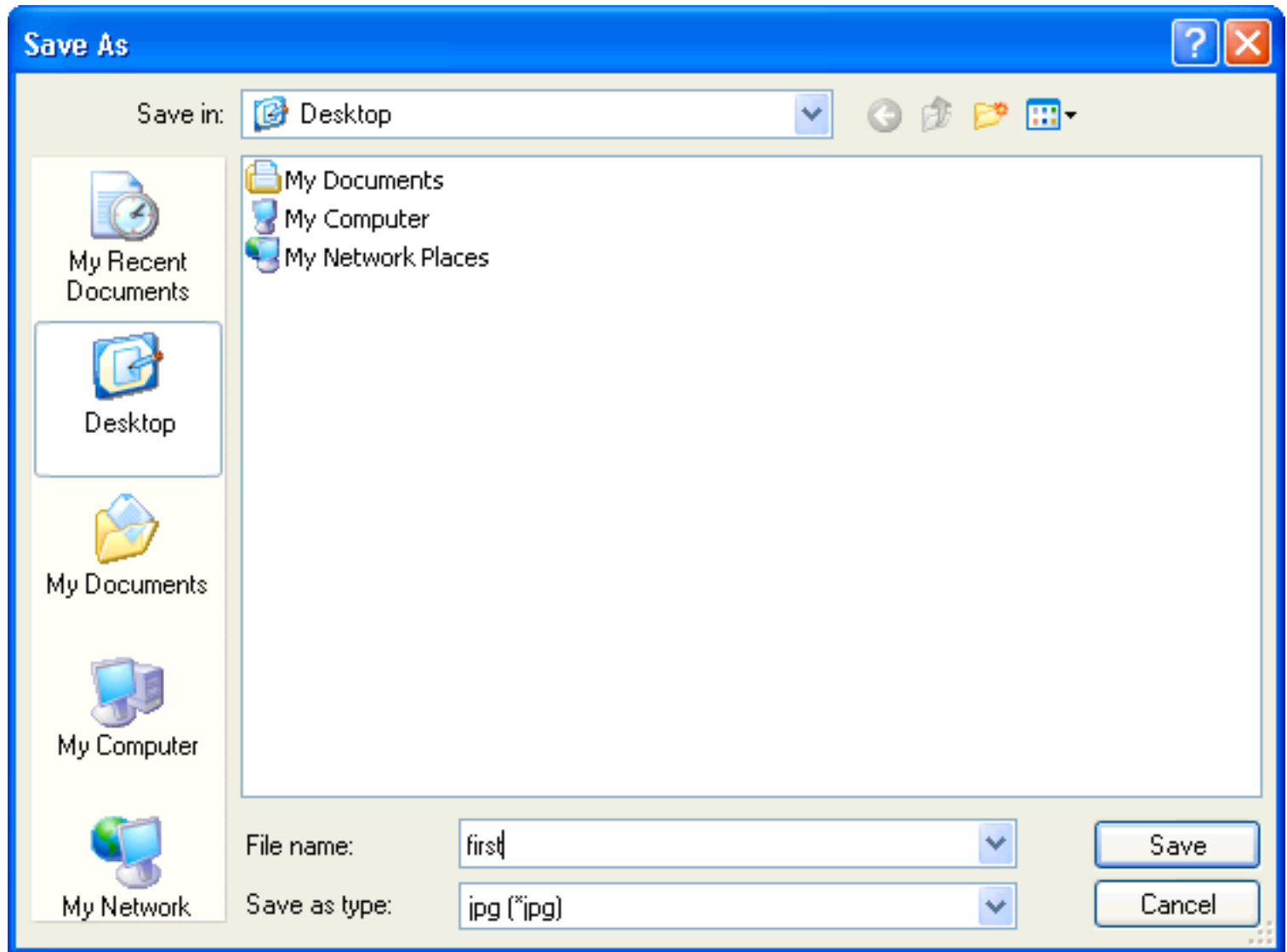
Step 7

When you let go of the mouse button, PicCutter will show you the cut out picture and ask if you want to save it. Click yes if you are happy with the image you cut out.



Step 8

Choose a location for the file and enter a name.



Step 9

Repeat steps 6-8 to cut out more pictures.

Step 10

When you have finished, all the pictures you cut out and saved can be synched to your iPad to be used in PicBoard. Please see the following Apple support document for more information about how to synchronise photos to your iPad.
